Message from the Principal

S.B. Deorah College, established in 1984 under the pioneering leadership of some visionaries of Ulubari area of Guwahati is a prominent seat of higher learning in the North East. Here, we strive to impart quality education to the learners who come from various parts of the region. We also try to imbibe the core values of life to the students so that they become good human beings and good citizens. Affiliated to Gauhati University, we have been providing conventional Arts, Science and Commerce education in all these years. One of our priority areas is development of skills among the students and we have been offering some vocational and job-oriented Certificate and Add-on courses. We aspire to introduce some professional programmes like BCA and BBA from this session.

Centrally located in the city of Guwahati, we have very good infrastructure in the campus. We have a digital smart classroom cum conference room with video conferencing facility. Our science laboratories are also state-of-the-art. We have replaced the traditional white/green boards with Digital Interactive panels to make the classroom environment more interesting and interactive. Currently, 14 of our classrooms are fitted with interactive panels. In our New Academic Building, we have housed three classrooms and the Girls' Common Room in the ground floor. The Central Library is in the first and second floor of the new building. Our library is fully computerized with SOUL Web-OPAC facility and the Digital library section is also well equipped. The second floor also houses faculty rooms of two Science departments apart from a classroom. In the year 2023-24, we have added two more floors to the New Academic Building. In this year, we have added the 3rd floor to our main building and also provided facelift to the front side of the building. We have an Internet Leased Line (ILL) to provide wi-fi internet connectivity to the students as well as faculty. We also have a well-equipped and fully furnished Girls' Hostel in the campus. We have a 25 Kw solar power plant in the campus.

Maintenance of discipline, punctuality and regularity is top priority of this institution. The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of the College takes care of improving quality and suggests measures for overall development of the College. Apart from NAAC which re-accredited our College in Nov. 2015, our College is also listed under NIRF since 2019-20. We have established an Institution's Innovation Council (IIC) as per Guidelines of AICTE and organizing various programmes on entrepreneurship, start-up, innovation etc. We are trying to our level best so that the students have the feeling that they are getting the best of facilities and qualities required in a Higher Educational Institute. During the COVID 19 pandemic, we introduced online classes and we are continuing with it in a blended mode with classroom teaching. We have also uploaded many study materials and Class videos and audios in our online portal for the benefit of the students. We have also forged several collaborations and MoUs with other Institutions and jointly undertaking various academic and co-curricular activities/initiatives. We can assure that after passing out, our students will fondly remember the College and call themselves a proud alumnus of this institution.

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A brief history :

Sreenivas Basudev Deorah College, popularly referred to as S.B.Deorah College, nestles in an ideal location in the arterial G.S.Road of Guwahati. Formerly named, Ulubari College, this institution started functioning in the premises of the neighbouring Ulubari High School in the evening on 9th September 1984 with 75 students in its roll for the higher secondary programme.

The college has been set up with the painstaking efforts of a few academically conscious personalities who felt the need of an institution of higher education in the Ulubari locality. Late Chidananda Das, former Registrar of Gauhati University, was the founder President of the Steering Committee of the College. On 9th September 1987, the college started functioning from its own temporary Assam-type shed. It was upgraded to the status of Degree College in the same year.

At a public meeting held on 4th November 1989, it was decided to entrust S.B. Deorah Charitable Trust to construct a two storeyed R.C.C. building with a plinth area of 9000 sq. feet for the college. Accordingly the building was constructed, providing the required infrastructure for all administrative work, teaching-learning and co-curricular activities. In recognition to the contribution of the trust, the Ulubari College Authority renamed the college after Sreenivas Basudev Deorah as S.B. Deorah College.

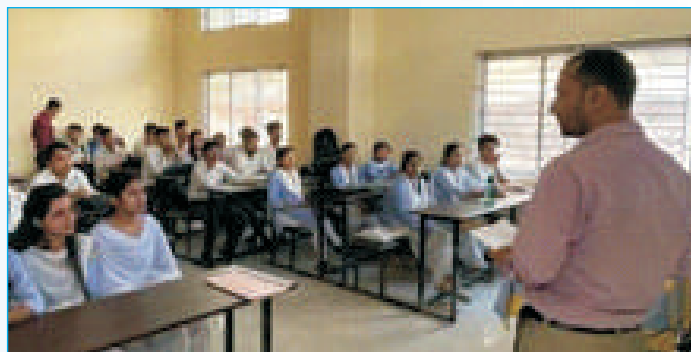
The college is affiliated to the Gauhati University and came under the deficit grant-in-aid schemes of the Government of Assam on 11th January 1996. It has attained permanent UGC registration under Section 2(f) & 12 (B) of UGC Act, 1956, in the year 2005.

The college has remained tall and strong for 39 years since its inception, moving from strength to strength. It stands as an emblem of knowledge and wisdom, where the students are nurtured to be better individuals and to be useful members of society. An efficient and firm administration, along with a team of dedicated and sincere faculty members are committed to the goal of providing quality education and creating a harmonious and healthy environment, making the students self-sufficient, and instilling in them the confidence to realize their dreams.

ADOPTION OF FYUGP UNDER NEP 2020 BY GAUHATI UNIVERSITY

Gauhati University's Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) adheres to the UGC's Curriculum Framework. FYUGP's course structure is based on the CBCS (Choice-Based Credit System). The FYUGP is mostly based on the liberal arts education system.

Salient features

- ❖ **Duration:** Under NEP's FYUGP, one has a 4-year degree programme.
- ❖ **Exits and Entries:** Under FYUGP, one has the choice to exit from the programme thrice – after one year, after two years, and after three years. If one exits the programme after one year, one gets a certificate. If one exits after two years, one gets a diploma. If one exits after three years, one gets a Bachelor's Degree. And finally, if a student completes the whole 4-year, one gets a Bachelor's Degree(Honours).
- ❖ **Honours and Major :** In FYUGP, a student gets a Bachelor's Degree with a major after 3 years and a Degree with Major & Honours after 4 years.
- ❖ **Progression:** If a student exits the FYUGP after 3 years, she/he will need to take admission in to the first year of a Master's programme, which is a 2-year degree programme. However, if a student fully completes an FYUGP, she/he needs to take admission into the second year of a Master's programme and needs to complete only one year to get a Master's degree.

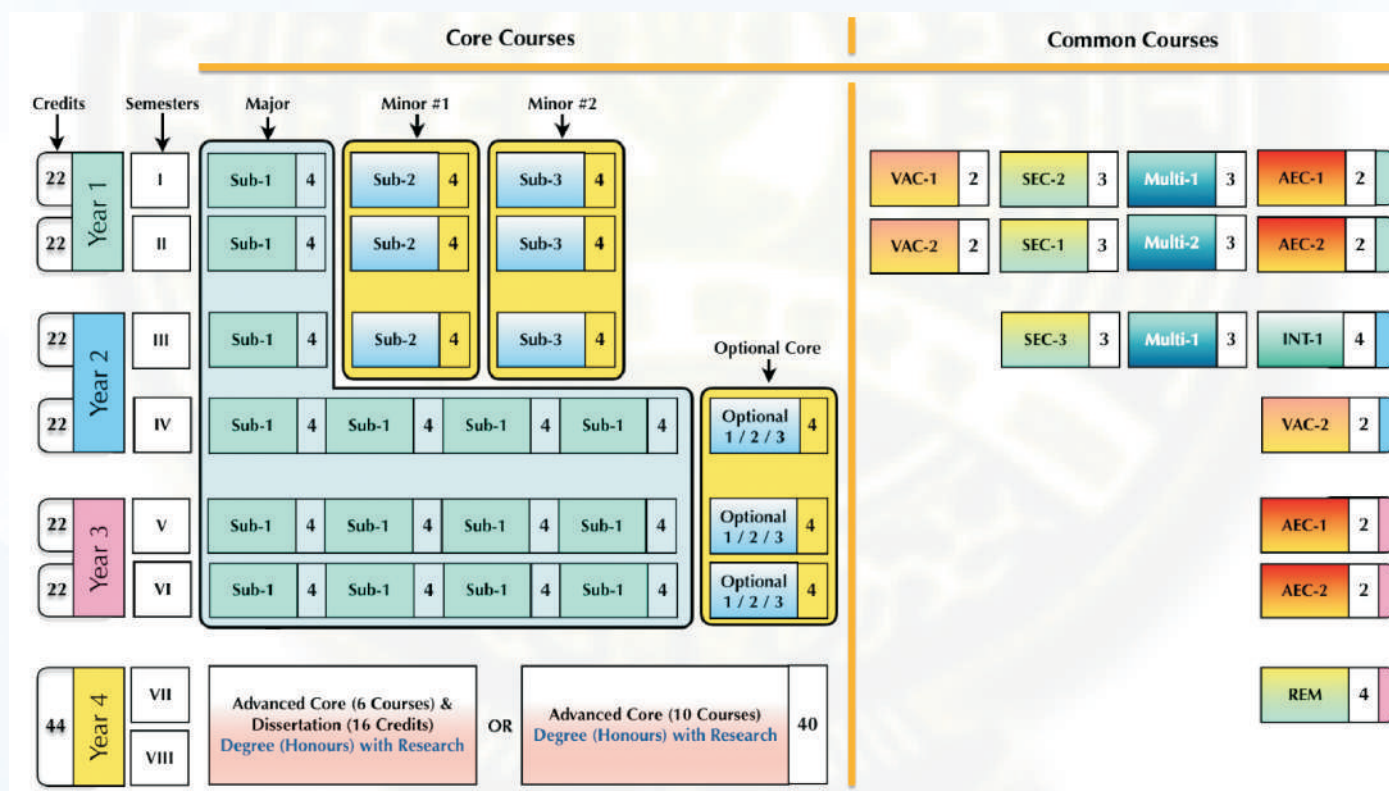
FYUGP has two parts:

- (a) **Core Courses** and
- (b) **Common Courses**

Different students study different core courses, and all students study the common courses.

- (a) **Core Courses:** These are discipline specific compulsory papers to be studied by the students. All the papers under this category will carry four credits each –a minimum requirement of 84 credits in totality and 21 courses (papers) in total. At least three core subjects need to be studied. Usually, for majority of the students, the Core Course will consist of one Major and two Minors.
- (b) **Common Courses:** The common courses are to be studied by all students alike and all together they carry a total credit of 36 over a three-year period. The common courses are further divided into 5 sub categories:
 1. **Multi-disciplinary Courses (MDC):** All UG students must take three introductory-level courses, relating to any of the broad disciplines. These three courses will carry 3-credits each from the eight sub-groups of courses from semester 1-3.
 2. **Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC):** This is an 8-credit course covering Language / Alternative English and English Usage (Communication), each covering 4 credits. Both these courses are further divided into two 2 credit courses each. The English Communication course is to be completed during Semesters 2 & 6, and Language / Alternative English course is to be completed during Semesters 1 & 5.
 3. **Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC):** These are various skill courses with total credit allocation of 9. All students need to complete three skill courses, each with 3 credits during Semesters 1–3.
 4. **Value Added Courses (VAC):** These courses aim to enable the students to acquire and demonstrate certain values. All together, they will have a credit allocation of 6.
 5. **Internship Courses (INT):** All students need to carry out internships with credit allocation of 4 in semesters 3-6.

STUDENTS' SUPPORT SERVICES

College Library:

S.B. Deorah College has a modern fully computerized central library having more than 17500 collections of text and reference books. The library has shifted to a newly constructed state-of-the-art duplex building spreading over an area of around 350 square meter in the first floor and 250 square meter in the second floor of the building. The library regularly subscribes to latest publication of books in different subject areas for Arts, Science and Commerce streams. Besides books, the Library also subscribes to a good number of periodicals and research journals pertaining to different subjects taught in the college. Popular magazines, dozens of daily and weekly regional & national newspapers etc are also available in the reading room of the

library. Library practices Open Access System which allows the users to go to the stacks of books from which he/ she can select the desired book. Online Public Access System (OPAC) available in the library helps them to search books using different operators like author, title, subject etc. The library serves the students, faculty and employees of the college in their curriculum preparation, leisure reading, teaching and research activities. It has a separate reading room facility for both students and teachers



The library provides free Internet facility to the students over a number of networked computers available in the Reading Room which help them to access various online e-resources of their curriculum and also help them to develop their all-round knowledge. It has the facility to access various online e-resources through INFLIBNET's N-LIST (National Library and Information Services).

Infrastructure for Scholarly Content) programme which provides access to more than 6,000 online e-journals, more than 1,95,000 e-books covering a wide range of subjects in the field of science, social science, humanity etc. Besides, the library also has an Institutional (IR) cum Digital Library on the cloud server <http://www.sbdeorahcollege.digitallibrary.co.in/> through which

Repository publications of the college, previous question papers as well as various online e-resources can be accessed by the students and academic fraternity. The library has recently introduced cloud based Web OPAC which allows users to access library catalogues online remotely from anywhere through the website <https://sbdcollegelibrary.webopac.online/>.

The library also maintains a Book Bank Cell which benefits of students belonging to economically weaker sections of the society. These books are issued for a full session to the bonafide deserving students of the college. The library is also organizing user orientation programme for the freshers in order to make them familiar with the library systems and procedures.

Scholarship & Incentives :

Besides the scholarship provided by the State Government, the college authority has also announced some new schemes of scholarship for the students from the academic session 2003-04. Two scholarships in the name of the former President of Governing Body Late Pratap Ch. Deka and his wife Late Kunjalata Deka are given to the students who secure the highest marks in TDC and H.S. Final Examination.

From the session 2016-17 a new scholarship in the name of Late Ashok Kumar Deorah-Faith, Diligence & Stoic Scholarship, sponsored by Mr. Amrit Deorah, Proprietor of Ashroy Concept Foods, has been introduced. Under this Mr. Deorah has offered to contribute Rs. 1.0 Lakh every year which is distributed among the needy and meritorious students of the College. A Scholarship for meritorious students is also offered by Basanta Kr. Das and Basanti Devi Charitable Trust.

Girls' Hostel:

S.B. Deorah College Women's Hostel is situated within the college campus which is under the supervision of Hostel Supervision Committee. The hostel is a 3 storeyed R.C.C building with residential complex for the Hostel Superintendent and the support staff. It has well furnished spacious and well-lit rooms. The food catered is hygienically prepared and nutritious. Facilities like newspapers, indoor games and a television set are also provided. At present the hostel accommodates 30 boarders who are given admission strictly on merit. The supervision and care of the boarders is looked after by the Hostel Superintendent along with the internal management of the hostel.

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC):

IQAC is an important organ of the college. It has been working as per guidelines of NAAC. The IQAC prepares the Annual Quality Assurance Reports (AQARs) of the college. The IQAC suggest measure for overall development and particularly improvement of academic environment of college. The IQAC also co-ordinates the works of various cells and sub- committees of the college. Dr. Sagar Sharma, Assistant Professor of Chemistry is the present co-ordinator of IQAC.

Institution's Innovation Council (IIC):

The College constituted an Institution's Innovation Council (IIC) in 2021 as per the recommendation of the Ministry of Education (MoE), Govt. of India. The IIC programme was launched by MoE at national level in 2018 in collaboration with AICTE for higher educational institutions (HEI). The objective of the programme is to systematically foster the culture of innovation and start-up ecosystem in HEI's and also to engage large numbers of students, faculty and staff in various innovation & entrepreneurship related activities such as Ideation, Problem Solving, Design Thinking, IPR, Project handling at pre-incubation & incubation stage so that Innovation and Entrepreneurship ecosystem get established in HEI's. The IIC of the college has 29



members which includes faculty members, students as well as external members with Dr. Dharmendra Nath as President and Dr. Dhruvajit Das as Convener of the Council. The IIC undertakes various calendar activities advised by MoE as well as self-driven activities through out the year for the benefit of students' community.

Anti Ragging Committee (ARC):

The college has an Anti-Ragging committee which supervises and advises to create a Ragging free environment in the college campus.

Equal Opportunity Cell (EOC):

The equal opportunity cell was created by the mandate of

the UGC, specifying the need of a functionary within the college setup. It was established to address issues related to the students belonging to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Other Backward Classes, Minorities and the Persons with Disabilities (PWD's) on a continual basis and empower such students to participate fully in the academic, intellectual, social and cultural life of the college on an equal basis.

Digital Learning Cell (DLC):

The Digital Learning Cell, nestled within the college infrastructure, orchestrates a seamless integration of digital tools and resources, facilitating an enriched and interactive learning experience for students and faculty alike. It serves as a hub for innovation, striving to optimize technological advancements to enhance educational outcomes within the academic community.

Intellectual Property Rights Cell (IPR Cell):

Situated within the college campus, the Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) Cell vigilantly protects innovative endeavors, ensuring the safeguarding of intellectual property through legal frameworks and education, fostering a culture of creativity and respect for innovation.

Electoral Literacy Club (ELC):

The Electoral Literacy Club engages students through interesting activities and hands-on experience to sensitise them on their electoral rights and familiarize them with the electoral process of registration and voting. It aims at strengthening the culture of electoral participation among young and future voters.

Career Guidance and Counseling Cell (CGCC)

The Career Guidance and Counseling Cell was established to create awareness regarding career prospects, self-employment, and entrepreneurship development among the students and helps the students to find career and other employment opportunities. The Cell organizes career related seminar, talks etc. on a regular basis for the benefits of the students by inviting competent persons.

World Wide Fund for Nature (WWF)

The college has signed an MoU with WWF- India in the year 2018. Since, then the college has actively participated in the events organized by WWF-India which play an important part in creating awareness about environmental degradation and protection amongst the student's community and nearby areas.

Social Media Handles

The College promotes its activities through different Social Media platforms such as Facebook, Twitter, YouTube, Instagram and LinkedIn. The Class videos and audios are regularly updated in the YouTube channel of the college which has been linked to the both the college portal (www.sbdeorahonline.in) and the college website (www.sbdeorahcollege.org.in) for easy access by the students.

Remedial and Tutorial Classes

The College has made provision for remedial classes for providing academic assistance to needy students within the college hours.

Coaching Classes for Entry into Services

The College has made provision for providing coaching for entry into services for Degree students by experts as well as members of the college faculty.

Canteen

The Canteen of the College has been serving the students with healthy and Hygenic food at subsidized price.

Grievance Redressal Cell

There is a Grievance Redressal Cell in the College to address grievances of students. The college has also introduced a Students' Feed Back system to assess the teaching learning process and evaluate the programme and course outcome. Students can collect the feedback forms from the Grievance Redressal Cell and can submit the same in the box specified for the said purpose.

Extension Services Cell

The College has constituted an Extension Services Cell which aims to implement community oriented programmes like literacy campaigning, health awareness programmes, cultural and personality development programmes etc. for the welfare of the various sections of the society within its proximity.

Health Care Cell

The Health Care Cell of the College organizes free health check-ups every year for the students of the college. It also organises seminars and lectures on various health related issues.

Women Cell

The Women Cell of the College works for the general welfare and safety of the girl students. Generation of awareness on gender specific issues through various workshops and seminars is also one of its foremost concerns. Building a gender friendly atmosphere where girl students can engage in academic pursuit is the avowed mission of the Cell.



Gender Sensitisation Committee Against Sexual Harassment (GSCASH)

Following the guidelines on the prevention and deterrence of sexual harassment at workplace, laid down by the Supreme Court of India in its 23 August 1997 judgement on the Writ Petition (Criminal) Vishaka v/s State of Rajasthan, the Principal of S.B. Deorah College setup the Gender Sensitisation Committee Against Sexual Harassment (GSCASH) vide a notification dated 13 April, 2021. The College is committed to providing a place of work and study, free of sexual harassment, intimidation or exploitation.

Students' Union

The S.B. Deorah College Students Union (SBDCSU) is an elected representative body of the students in the college. Its office bearers are elected annually on the basis of election as per direction of Lyngdoh Committee recommendations. Students whose class attendances are less than 75% cannot contest in the Students' Election. Its function is subject to the guidance and control of the college authority. All regular students of the college are entitled to participate and contest in the election process.

Alumni Association

The College has a registered alumni association with its office in the college campus. The association was created to provide a channel to all alumni of the college to participate in the development process of the college.

Students' Welfare Cell

The Cell offers financial aid to meritorious cum economically challenged students in the form of providing text



books, exemption of tuition fees etc. Besides, talented students excelling in extra-curricular activities are also offered aid. The Cell also offers counselling to students to find solutions to their problems.

Environment Cell

The college constituted the Environment Cell which aims to spread awareness in developing a green consciousness among the students and the faculty members. It celebrates different days related to the environment as well as works towards a green campus.

Internet and Photocopy Facility

Unlimited Internet access and photocopy facility is available for the students in the College Library

Auditorium

The College has a spacious auditorium of seating capacity of 750 persons with a permanent stage for performing various academic and cultural activities.

Digital Classroom with Video-Conferencing Facility

The College possesses 14 Digital/ Smart class- rooms fitted with interactive panel to make the teaching-learning process more interactive

ACADEMIC & CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Sessional and Annual Examination

In each semester, sessional exams are conducted, followed by a final exam scheduled according to the exam routine provided by Gauhati University.

Seminars and Workshops

Seminars and Workshops, which are integral part of the teaching learning process, are held by the departments at regular intervals. Multi-disciplinary seminars are also held in the college and scholars from various fields are invited.

Educational Tour

Various Departments of the College organize educational tours with a view to expose students with cultures, history, geography, and also to familiarize them with the flora and fauna of the country.

Literary Activities

The College publishes a number of Magazines to encourage student and faculty in participation in literary activities. The college magazine "UDIAN" is published annually by the Students' Union of the College. A yearly news bulletin namely "The Chronicler" is published every year to highlight various activities of the college. Besides, students of department of political science prepare a hand written Magazines "Sparkle", while the name of the magazines by students of As- samese department is "Sadhana". Furthermore, to develop the literary and intellectual quality of the students, all de- partments of the college bring out Wall Magazines viz. STUDENTS' CODE OF CONDUCT

Discipline Among the Students : All students are expected to maintain high standard of discipline. They must abide by the rules and regulations of the college authority. Violation of rules would make a student liable for disciplinary action like termination of scholarship, forced transfer, and even expulsion from the college. Any willful damage or theft of college property will be treated as serious offence and will be dealt sternly.

Attendance : Students must be regular and punctual in attending their classes. It is to be noted that at least 75% attendance is essential for appearing in Council and University exam failing which he/ she shall be treated as non-collegiate. A non-collegiate student will be debarred from appearing in sessional examinations. A student failing to attend classes for 25 days at a stretch from the date of commencement of classes will forfeit his/ her seat.

College Uniform : It is mandatory for all students to use the standard prescribed college uniform. The female students would have the option to choose either the prescribed salwar kameez or shirt and trousers as their preferred uniform. Students without proper uniform will be refused entry into the college campus. The details of the outlets from where the uniform can be purchased will be given on the day of the admission.

College Identity Card : A non-transferable Identity Card will be issued to all students. Students must carry their identity card at all the times inside the college premises and must be produced whenever demanded.

Ragging : Ragging in any form inside the college premises and in the women's hostel is strictly prohibited. Students indulging in Ragging will be punished severely as per the existing directives of the Supreme Court/ High Court.
