Message from the Principal

S.B. Deorah College, established in 1984 under the pioneering leadership of some visionaries of Ulubari, Guwahati is a prominent seat of higher learning in the North East. Here, we strive to impart quality education to the learners who come from various parts of the region. We also try to imbibe the core values of life to the students to become good human beings and good citizens. Affiliated to the Gauhati University, we have been providing conventional Arts, Science and Commerce education throughout these years. One of our priorities is skill development among students and we have been offering some vocational and job-oriented Certificate and Add-on courses. We successfully introduced two AICTE approved professional programmes BCA and BBA under the Assam Science and Technology University (ASTU) from the session 2024-25.

Centrally located in the city of Guwahati, we have very good infrastructure in the campus. We have replaced the traditional white/green boards with Digital Interactive panels to make the classroom environment more interesting and interactive. Our science laboratories are also state-of-the-art. The Central Library, spreading to first and second floors in the New Academic Building, is fully computerized with SOUL 3.0 and Web OPAC facility. The Digital Library section is also well-equipped. In the year 2023-24, we added two more floors to the New Academic Building. Moreover, we added the 3rd floor to our main building and also provided facelift to the front side of the building. We have a 20Mbps Internet Leased Line (ILL) and fibre connections to provide Wi-Fi internet connectivity to the students as well as the faculties. Our Auditorium with seating capacity of 400 is air-conditioned. Our main conference room is also fully air-conditioned and fitted with parallel display systems, PTZ camera etc. We also have a well-equipped and fully furnished Girls' Hostel in the campus. We have recently renovated the College Canteen and added a Recreation Room cum Yoga Centre for the benefit and welfare of the college fraternity. Moreover, the existing Folk and Ethnic Museum has been renovated with a new outlook.

Maintenance of discipline, punctuality and regularity is the top priority of this institution. The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of the College takes care of improving quality and suggests measures for an overall growth and development of the college. Apart from NAAC accreditation, our College has been also listed under NIRF since 2019-20. We have established an Institution's Innovation Council (IIC) as per Guidelines of AICTE and organized various programmes on entrepreneurship, start-up, innovation etc. We are trying our level best to provide the best facilities and qualities for the students required in a Higher Educational Institution. The hallmark of our teaching pedagogy rests on experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving techniques. Along with classroom teaching, online classes are also held to promote the blended mode. We have also uploaded many Study Materials, Class Videos and Audios in our Online Portal for the benefit of the students. We have also built up several collaborations and MoUs with other Institutions and are jointly undertaking various academic and co-curricular activities/initiatives. We can assure that our students will cherish the quality times spent in the college and take pride to be an Alumnus of this prestigious institution in future.

A brief history :

Sreenivas Basudev Deorah College, popularly known as S.B. Deorah College, nestles in an ideal location in the arterial G.S. Road of Guwahati. This institution, initially Ulubari College, was inaugurated in the evening of 9th September, 1984 with 75 students enrolled for Higher Secondary programme, in the premises of the neighbouring Ulubari High School. The College has been set up with the painstaking efforts of a few academically conscious personalities who felt the need of an institution of higher education in the Ulubari locality. Late Chidananda Das, former Registrar of Gauhati University, was the founder President of the Steering Committee of the College. From 9th September 1987 onwards, the college started functioning from its own temporary Assam-type shed. It was upgraded to the status of Degree College in the same year.

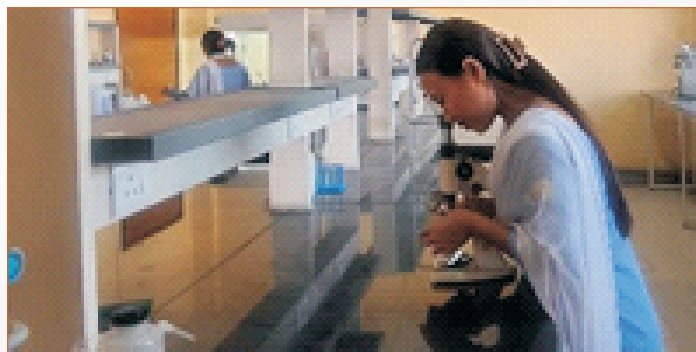
S. B. Deorah Charitable Trust was entrusted to construct a two- storeyed RCC building with a plinth area of 9000 sq. feet for the college, as finalized in a public meeting held on 4th November, 1989. Accordingly, the building was constructed with the required infrastructural facilities including administrative work, teaching-learning and co-curricular activities. To honour and recognize the contribution of the trust, the Ulubari College Authority renamed the college after Sreenivas Basudev Deorah or S. B. Deorah College. The college is affiliated to the Gauhati University and came under the deficit grant-in-aid schemes of Government of Assam on 11th January, 1996. It has attained permanent UGC registration under Section 2(f) & 12(B) of UGC Act, 1956, in the year 2005.

The college has been imparting quality education for more than 40 years since its inception and continues to grow with time. It stands as an emblem of knowledge and wisdom where the students are nurtured to be better individuals and responsible citizens of the nation. An efficient and firm administration along with a team of dedicated and sincere faculty members are committed to the goal of providing quality education and creating a harmonious and healthy environment making the students self-sufficient and instilling in them the confidence to realize their dreams. The college is enriched with students not only from Assam, but thronging from various neighbouring North-Eastern States, showcasing a culturally diverse yet united students' community as a whole.

Courses of study and number of seats in each course

The college offers Four Year Under Graduate Programme (FYUGP) in Arts, Science, and Commerce under Gauhati University. The college also offers AICTE approved BBA and BCA courses.

ADOPTION OF FYUGP UNDER NEP 2020 BY GAUHATI UNIVERSITY

Gauhati University's Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) adheres to the UGC's Curriculum Framework. The FYUGP's course structure is based on the CBCS (Choice-Based Credit System). The FYUGP is mostly based on the liberal arts education system.

Salient features:

The Gauhati University (GU) FYUGP Regulations provide for the following degrees:

3-year UG Degree:

- (i) **With Major:** Students who undergo a 3-year UG programme will be awarded UG Degree in the Major subject/discipline after successful completion of three years, securing 120 credits and satisfying the minimum credit requirement.
- (ii) **Without Major:** Students who undergo a 3-year UG programme without major (only Minor) will be awarded a UG Degree in the stream concerned (Arts/Science/Commerce) after successful completion of three years, securing 120 credits and satisfying the minimum credit requirement.

4-year UG Degree (Honours):

A student who has completed the three years of the FYUGP with Major may enroll for a four-year UG Honours degree in the major subject/discipline provided that the UG (Honours) degree will be awarded after completion of the four-year degree programme with a minimum of 160 credits.

4-year UG Degree (Honours with Research):

Students who secure overall 75% marks or 7.5 CGPA and above in the first six semesters (three years) and wish to undertake research at the undergraduate level can choose a research stream (Honours with Research) in the Major subject in the fourth year. Students who have not cleared all courses till their sixth semester shall not be allowed to enroll in the FYUGP for the Honours with Research degree. Admitted students shall do a research project or dissertation under the guidance of a duly recognized faculty member with Ph.D. degree of the College. The research project/dissertation will be in the Major subject. The students who secure 160 credits, including 12 credits from a research project/dissertation, are awarded UG Degree (Honours with Research).

- **Exits & Entries:** Under FYUGP, a student can exit after any year during the FYUGP. Depending on the exit level, a student can get a certificate, diploma, or a degree. If a student exits after one year into the programme, s/he will be eligible to get a certificate, if she clears all the courses at that point of time. Similarly, s/he will be getting a diploma if s/he exists after two years into the programme, after clearing all the courses up to that point of time. Eventually, after three years, s/he will get a Bachelor's Degree.

Course Framework: Core Courses and Common Courses:

(a) Core Courses & (b) Common Courses

Different students study different core courses, and all students study the common courses.

- (a) **Core Courses:** These are discipline-specific compulsory papers to be studied by the students. All papers under this category carry four credits each—a minimum requirement of **84 credits** in totality and **21 courses (papers)** in total by the third year. At least two core subjects need to be studied. Usually, for majority of the students, the Core Course will consist of one Major and one Minor.
- (b) **Common Courses:** The common courses are to be studied by all students alike and all together they carry a total credit of 36 over a three-year period. The common courses are further divided into 5 sub-categories:
 1. **Multi-disciplinary Courses (MDC):** These are 3-credit courses spanning over eight different groups of subjects — (i) Natural and Physical Science, (ii) Mathematical Sciences (iii) Library, Information, and Media Sciences, (iv) Commerce and Management, and (v) Humanities and Social Sciences (vi) Information and Communication Technologies (vii) Life Sciences and (viii) Earth Sciences. The levels of these courses are of Class XII. All UG students must take three introductory-level courses, relating to any of the broad disciplines. These three courses will carry 3-credits each from these sub-groups of courses from semester 1-3.
 2. **Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC):** This is an 8-credit course covering Modern Indian Languages (MIL) and English Usage (Communication), each covering 4 credits. Thus, a student needs to complete two papers carrying a credit of 2 each from English Usage and from the group of MIL.
 3. **Skill enhancement Courses (SEC):** These are various skill courses with total credit allocation of 9. All students need to complete three skill courses, each with 3 credits during Semesters 1-3.

4. **Value Added Courses(VAC):** These courses aim to enable the students to acquire and demonstrate certain values. All together they will have a credit allocation of 6.
5. **Internship Courses(INT):** All students need to carry out internship with credit allocation of 4 in semesters 4-6. As internships are meant to be done during semester breaks, they will not interfere with other classes.

The students will have to indicate their choices/ preferences of Major/ Minor Courses in the appropriate place in the Application Form. The College will allocate desired choices of the students on the basis of their merit and subject to availability of seats. For Common Courses, the students can indicate their choices when the session begins. In accordance with the academic and administrative constraints of the college, the following Major and Minor subject pairings/combinations are **currently unavailable** for enrollment under the Gauhati University FYUGP framework in the college:

- ❖ Assamese (Major/Minor) and English (Major/Minor)
- ❖ Education (Major/Minor) and History (Major/Minor)
- ❖ Economics (Major/Minor) and Philosophy (Major/Minor)

PROFESSIONAL COURSES (AICTE APPROVED)

BBA (Bachelor of Business Administration) : S.B. Deorah College offers AICTE approved BBA (Bachelor of Business Administration) Degree under the affiliation of Assam Science and Technology University (ASTU). The course offers numerous benefits, including a strong foundation in business principles, diverse career options, and opportunities for personal and professional development. It equips graduates with essential skills in areas like management, finance, marketing, and human resources, making them well-prepared for various roles in both the private and public sectors.

BCA (Bachelor of Computer Applications) : S.B. Deorah College offers AICTE approved BCA (Bachelor of Computer Applications) Degree under the affiliation of Assam Science and Technology University (ASTU). The degree focuses on the design, development, and deployment of software systems with a special focus on the design and analysis of software security. It also focuses on practical applications of computer science. The course prepares students for careers in the IT sector, particularly in areas like software development, web design, and database management.

STUDY CENTRE OF KKHSOU

KK Handiqui State Open University (KKHSOU) is a state university offering courses in distance and open mode. S.B. Deorah college has a study centre of KKHSOU which cater to the needs of learners willing to pursue higher education in the distance and open mode. The centre has been offering B.A. course since 2013. Dr. D. Das, Librarian, is the Co- Ordinator of the study centre.

GAUHATI UNIVERSITY CENTRE FOR DISTANCE AND ONLINE EDUCATION(GUCDOE):

The College has been allotted a Study Centre of GUCDOE (Formerly known as IDOL), Gauhati University from the Academic Session 2019-20 to impart Post Graduate courses in the following subjects. The Centre will greatly benefit the desiring students to pursue higher studies. Md. Magrul Hussain, Associate Professor, is the Co-Ordinator of the Study Centre.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- ❖ Registration and Admission in the degree programmes will take place through the online mode. Students seeking admission should register in the admission portal www.assamadmission.samarth.ac.in.
- ❖ Registration for admission to the college must be done by filling all the mandatory fields in the admission portal. Students will be selected strictly on the basis of merit. Admission procedure is governed by the college admission rules and the decision taken by the Principal will be treated as the final for merit list. Please visit sbdeorahcollege.org.in
- ❖ The College follows the reservation policy as per Govt. of Assam norms.
- ❖ Request/pressure for admission from any quarters will not be entertained under any circumstances.
- ❖ Students who have passed the qualifying examination in the earlier year(s) will have to submit an authentic gap certificate issued by a competent authority.
- ❖ Students selected for admission must get themselves admitted within the stipulated date, failing which they will forfeit their seats.
- ❖ Admission to the College Girls' Hostel will be made on merit basis.
- ❖ Documents such as mark sheets, age proof, caste certificate, and photograph are to be uploaded while filling up the online application form. The original certificates and documents will be verified on the day of actual admission.

STUDENTS' SUPPORT SERVICES

College Library:

S.B. Deorah College has a modern fully computerized central library having more than 17500 collections of text and reference books. The library has shifted to a newly constructed state-of-the-art duplex building spreading over an area of around 350 square meter in the first floor and 250 square meter in the second floor of the building. The library regularly subscribes to latest publication of books in different subject areas for Arts, Science and Commerce streams. Besides books, the library also subscribes to a good number of periodicals and research





journals pertaining to different subjects taught in the college. Popular magazines, dozens of daily and weekly regional & national newspapers etc are also available in the reading room of the library. Library practices Open Access System which allows the users to go to the stacks of books from which he/ she can select the desired book. Online Public Access System (OPAC) available in the library helps them to search books using different operators like author, title, subject etc. The library serves the students, faculty and employees of the college in their curriculum preparation, leisure reading, teaching and research activities. It has a separate reading room facility for both students and teachers.

The library provides free Internet facility to the students

over a number of networked computers available in the Reading Room which help them to access various online e-resources of their curriculum and also help them to develop their all-round knowledge. It has the facility to access various online e-resources through INFLIBNET's N-LIST (National Library and Information Services).

Infrastructure for Scholarly Content programme which provides access to more than 6,000 online e-journals, more than 1,95,000 e-books covering a wide range of subjects in the field of science, social science, humanity etc. Besides, the library also has an Institutional (IR) cum Digital Library on the cloud server <http://www.sbdeorahcollege.digitallibrary.co.in/> through which



Repository publications of the college, previous question papers as well as various online e-resources can be accessed by the students and academic fraternity. The library has recently introduced cloud based Web OPAC which allows users to access library catalogues online remotely from anywhere through the website <https://sbdcollegelibrary.webopac.online/>.

The library also maintains a Book Bank Cell which benefits of students belonging to economically weaker sections of the society. These books are issued for a full session to the bonafide deserving students of the college. The library is also organizing user orientation programme for the freshers in order to make them familiar with the library systems and procedures.

Scholarship & Incentives

Besides the scholarship provided by the State Government, the college authority has also announced some new schemes of scholarship for the students from the academic session 2003-04. Two scholarships in the name of the former President of Governing Body Late Pratap Ch. Deka and his wife Late Kunjalata Deka are given to the students who secure the highest marks in TDC and H.S. Final Examination. A Scholarship for meritorious students is also offered by Basanta Kr. Das and Basanti Devi Charitable Trust.

From the session 2016-17 a new scholarship in the name of Late Ashok Kumar Deorah-Faith, Diligence & Stoic Scholarship,



sponsored by Mr. Amrit Deorah, Proprietor of Ashroy Concept Foods, has been introduced. Under this Mr. Deorah has offered to contribute Rs. 1.0Lakh every year which is distributed among the needy and meritorious students of the College

Girls' Hostel

S.B. Deorah College Women's Hostel is situated within the college campus which is under the supervision of Hostel Supervision Committee. The hostel is a 3 storeyed R.C.C building with residential complex for the Hostel Superintendent and the support staff. It has well-furnished spacious and well-lit rooms. The food catered is hygienically prepared and nutritious. Facilities like newspapers, indoor games and a television set are also provided. At present the hostel accommodates 30 boarders who are given admission strictly on merit. The supervision and care of the boarders is looked after by the Hostel Superintendent along with the internal management of the hostel.

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)

An important organ of the college, the IQAC works as per the guidelines of NAAC. The IQAC prepares the Annual

Quality Assurance Reports (AQARs) and suggests measures for overall development and improvement of academic environment of college. The IQAC also co-ordinates the works of various cells and sub-committees of the college. Dr. Sagar Sharma, Assistant Professor of Chemistry is the present Co-Ordinator of IQAC.

Institution's Innovation Council (IIC)

Constituted as per the recommendation of the Ministry of Education (MoE), Govt. of India in 2021, the Institution's Innovation Council (IIC) programme was launched by MoE at national level in 2018 in collaboration with AICTE for higher educational institutions (HEI). The objective of the programme is to systematically foster the culture of innovation and start-up ecosystem in HEI's and also to engage large numbers of students, faculty and staff in various innovation & entrepreneurship related activities such as Ideation, Problem Solving, Design Thinking, IPR, Project handling at pre-incubation & incubation stage so that Innovation and Entrepreneurship ecosystem get established in HEI's. The IIC of the college has 29 members which includes

faculty members, students as well as external members with Dr. Dharmendra Nath as President and Dr. Dhruvajit Das as Convener of the Council. The IIC undertakes various calendar activities advised by MoE as well as self-driven activities throughout the year for the benefit of students' community.



Anti Ragging Committee (ARC)

The college has an Anti-Ragging committee which supervises and advises to create a Ragging free environment in the college campus.

Equal Opportunity Cell (EOC)

The Equal Opportunity Cell was created by the mandate of the UGC, specifying the need of a functionary within the college setup. It was established to address issues related to the students belonging to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Other Backward Classes, Minorities and the Persons with Disabilities (PWD's) on a continual basis and empower such students to participate fully in the academic, intellectual, social and cultural life of the college on an equal basis.



Digital Learning Cell (DLC)

The Digital Learning Cell, nestled within the college infrastructure, orchestrates a seamless integration of digital tools and resources, facilitating an enriched and interactive learning experience for students and faculty alike. It serves as a hub for innovation, striving to optimize technological advancements to enhance educational outcomes within the academic community.

Intellectual Property Rights Cell (IPR Cell)

Situated within the college campus, the Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) Cell vigilantly protects innovative endeavors, ensuring the safeguarding of intellectual property through legal frameworks and education, fostering a culture of creativity and respect for innovation.

Electoral Literacy Club:

The Electoral Literacy Club engages students through interesting activities and hands-on experience to sensitise them on their electoral rights and familiarize them with the electoral process of registration and voting. It aims at strengthening the culture of electoral participation among young and future voters.

Career Guidance and Counseling Cell (CGCC)

The Career Guidance and Counseling Cell was established to create awareness regarding career prospects, self-employment, and entrepreneurship development among the students and helps the students to find career and other employment opportunities. The Cell organizes career related seminar, talks etc. on a regular basis for the benefits of the students by inviting competent persons.



Research and Development Cell (RDC)

The existing Research and Academic Cell is being reconstituted recently as Research and Development Cell. The Cell monitors all research-based activities and encourages both the faculties and the students for research-oriented programmes. The Cell consists of Dr. Dharmendra Nath, Principal of the college as the Co-Ordinator along with several faculty members. The cell also looks after the Internship Programme for fourth semester students under FYUGP, GU.

World Wide Fund for Nature(WWF)

The college has signed an MoU with WWF- India in the year 2018. Since, then the college has actively participated in the events organized by WWF-India which play an important part in creating awareness about environmental degradation and protection amongst the student's community and nearby areas.

Social Media Handles

Students' Union

STUDENTS' CODE OF CONDUCT

Discipline Among the Students

All students are expected to maintain a high standard of discipline. They must abide by the rules and regulations of the college authority. Violation of the rules will make a student liable for disciplinary action such as termination of scholarship, forced transfer, or even expulsion from the college. Any wilful damage to or theft of college property will be treated as a serious offence and will be dealt with sternly.

Attendance

Students must be regular and punctual in attending their classes. It is to be noted that at least 75% attendance is essential for appearing in university examinations, failing which he/she shall be treated as non-collegiate. A non-collegiate student will be debarred from appearing in sessional examinations. A student

failing to attend classes for 25 consecutive days from the date of commencement of classes will forfeit his/her seat.

College Uniform

It is mandatory for all students to use the standard prescribed college uniform. The female students would have the option to choose either the prescribed salwar kameez or shirt and trousers as their preferred uniform. Students without proper uniform will be refused entry into the college campus. The details of the outlets from where the uniform can be purchased will be given on the day of the admission.

College Identity Card

A non-transferable Identity Card will be issued to all students. Students must carry their identity card at all the times inside the college premises and must be produced when ever demanded.

Ragging

Ragging in any form inside the college premises and in the women's hostel is strictly prohibited. Students indulging in ragging will be punished severely as per the existing directives of the Supreme Court and High Court.

Cleanliness

Cleanliness of the college premises must be maintained at all times. Waste should be disposed of in the waste bins kept for the purpose. Writing on walls and sticking bills on the walls are strictly prohibited. Spitting is strictly prohibited. An en masse fine will be imposed on the offenders.

Tobacco Chewing

Smoking or chewing of tobacco, pan masala and gutkha in the campus is strictly banned as per Govt. order. Any one found even in possession will be expelled from the College.

Use of mobile phones in the college campus is highly restricted.
